- Baking/try a new recipe

- Write a letter to friends/family
- Make a collage with pictures from old magazines
- Look through baby photos/wedding albums
- Reading books
- Listen to a book-library has a good selection of audio books
- Make puppets and have a puppet show
- Write a book and illustrate it
- Playing games together
- Building dens with sheets/blankets
- Clean the house together. You could set a timer
- Gardening
- Wash the dog
- Wash the car
- Play cards
- Play frisbee/ball games
- Play charades
- Make a picnic-eat it in a den/garden/living room on a blanket





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- Complete puzzles together e.g. spot the difference, word search, jigsaws
- Dancing to favourite music
- Cardboard boxes- use imagination to create something e.g. castle, spaceship, boat, den
- Treasure Hunt- hide items around the house for your child to find or write a list of objects that they have to find.
